#### **Home Learning and Home Reading Survey Findings**

Another thank you to the parents/carers who gave their time to share their feedback about Home Learning and Home Reading at BPS. These families gave excellent insight and ideas on these topics which we have now collated into findings.

Some of the common opinions:

• Home Learning is highly valued.

All participants thought some type of task should be offered for students from Years 3-6. Most parents also thought K-2 students could benefit, but some were open to the idea of less expectations in the early years.

- Almost 100% of families value the provision of the elective-style grid activities.
- Reading should be encouraged from Kindergarten to Year 6.

Most families thought students would engage with an online digital reading program if access was given to every student free of charge and texts at their personal level were accessed. There were some concerns about families who may not have an appropriate device and some families would love to see 'real' books also still available.

- Numeracy was also mentioned as the other Key Learning Area parents would like to be kept as part of home learning.
- A large number of participants thought options of project-type assignments could be incorporated in Stage 3, or particularly Year 6, as students prepare for high school.
- And the final point, almost everyone has been in agreement on: is the plan to increase the number of book incentives throughout the year for Home Reading. Rather than one significant presentation at the end of the year, consistent home readers K-6, will be awarded each Term and hopefully help motivate others. Our end goal is more books in more homes more often!

## **Quality Work**


